The university has long-standing collaborations with institutions such as Maastricht University (Netherlands), Universiti Teknologi MARA (Malaysia), UNSW, UNIMAS, and Centro de Lenguas Modernas de la Universidad de Granada (Spain). These partnerships have facilitated academic exchanges, joint research, and student mobility programmes.

Through its International Office (IO), Universitas YARSI has expanded its presence in global higher education networks. The university has participated in international conferences, developed cooperative agreements, and established research initiatives with foreign partners.

ENHANCING INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH OUTPUT



Increasing the Number of Publications in Scopus-Indexed Journals:

- Providing research grants and publication incentives for faculty members and researchers who publish in highimpact journals.
- Organising writing workshops and mentoring programs to help faculty and postgraduate students refine their manuscripts for submission to reputable journals.
- Establishing research clusters focused on interdisciplinary topics with high publication potential, particularly in areas relevant to Indonesia and global academic discussions.
- Enhancing access to research resources, such as advanced data analysis tools, research databases, and professional editing services, to support high-quality publications.

·PromotingJoint Research Projects with Foreign Institutions:

- Facilitating collaborative research grants that involve international partners, ensuring that projects align with global academic priorities and funding opportunities.
- Strengthening faculty networks with researchers from worldwide institutions through participation in international conferences, academic forums, and visiting scholar programs.
- Leveraging digital platforms to enable virtual research collaborations, making international joint projects more feasible and inclusive.
- Encouraging interdisciplinary and cross-cultural research themes that highlight Indonesia's unique academic contributions to global knowledge.



EXPANDING GLOBAL PARTNERSHIPS

Strengthening Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with Foreign Universities and Research Institutions:

- Reviewing and revitaliing existing MoUs to ensure they lead to tangible academic outcomes, such as student exchanges, joint research, and faculty mobility.
- Expanding partnerships with universities in strategic regions, including ASEAN, Europe, and the Middle East, to diversify academic collaborations.
- Establishing industry-academia linkages with global research institutions and companies to support applied research and innovation.
- Ensuring MoUs translate into measurable academic benefits, such as co-authored publications, shared research funding, and international conference participation.

·Developing Double-Degree and Joint-Degree Programs:

- Partnering with internationally accredited universities to offer double-degree programs.
- Designing joint-degree programs where students can complete part of their studies abroad.
- Aligning curriculum standards with partner institutions to facilitate credit transfer and maintain academic quality.
- Providing financial support to encourage student participation in double-degree and joint-degree programs.



DEVELOPING AN INTERNATIONALISED CURRICULUM

·Implementing an Outcome-Based Education (OBE) Curriculum Aligned with Global Standards:

- Ensuring all academic programs adopt an OBE framework, focusing on student-centered learning and measurable competencies that align with international educational benchmarks.
- Regularly updating curricula based on global best practices, accreditation requirements (e.g., FIBAA), and input from industry and international academic partners.
- Integrating international case studies, research methodologies, and industry-driven competencies to prepare students for the global workforce.
- Encouraging active learning approaches and interdisciplinary projects that reflect real-world challenges.

·Introducing More English-Language Courses and Internationally Relevant Subjects:

- Offering courses on globally relevant topics such as sustainability, digital transformation, global health, and disaster resilience, climate change, and carbon pricing.
- Providing professional development programs for faculty members to enhance their proficiency in Englishmedium instruction (EMI).
- Encouraging the integration of international perspectives in all courses, including collaborative online international learning (COIL) initiatives.



INCREASING STUDENT AND FACULTY MOBILITY

·Facilitating Student Exchange and International Study Programs:

- Strengthening partnerships with international universities to create more exchange programs, dual-degree options, and short-term mobility opportunities.
- Providing scholarships or financial aid to support students in participating in overseas study programs.
- Enhancing credit transfer mechanisms to ensure that students receive academic recognition for their studies abroad.
- Promoting inbound exchange programs by offering English-taught courses and integrating international students into academic and cultural activities.

•Encouraging Faculty Participation in International Training and Research:

- Developing structured programs for faculty members to join international training, workshops, and research collaborations.
- Establishing funding schemes or institutional support for faculty members to participate in global academic events, such as conferences and joint research initiatives.
- Fostering visiting professor programs where international scholars can contribute to teaching and research at Universitas YARSI, and vice versa.
- Aligning faculty mobility programs with strategic university goals, ensuring that international exposure translates into improved teaching quality and research output.



ACHIEVING INTERNATIONAL ACCREDITATION

- Progress with FIBAA Accreditation:
 - Universitas YARSI has submitted its Self-Evaluation Report (SER) to the Foundation for International Business Administration Accreditation (FIBAA), marking a significant milestone in the accreditation process.
 - The university is currently preparing for the FIBAA site visit scheduled for February 2025, ensuring that all necessary documentation, faculty readiness, and institutional facilities align with FIBAA's international quality standards.
 - Internal quality assurance teams are conducting mock assessments and refining policies based on feedback to strengthen the university's accreditation readiness.
 - The accreditation process will not only validate academic programs against global benchmarks but also enhance the university's appeal to prospective international students and faculty.
